"Where is he?" the king asked. Ziba answered, "He is at the house of Makir son of Ammiel in Lo Debar." So King David had him brought from Lo Debar, from the house of Makir son of Ammiel.

David and God are relentless about seeking out the disadvantaged.

Mephibosheth lived in Lo Debar where he was hiding from David's sword.

David took Mephibosheth from a barren place and seated him in a bountiful place.

David adopted Mephibosheth into his family, and he became the king's son.

At the royal table Mephibosheth became an equal recipient of David's love.
